Annual Service

In Fiscal Year 2016-2017,
Family Support Center served
3,223 individuals with
69,343 hours of direct care.







Services Provided in 2016-2017

Adoption Respite Care: In-home respite care for adoptive families. 200 children in 37 families were served in 273 visits totaling over 1,637 hours of care.

Counseling Services: Professional therapy for children, families, and individuals. 446 clients received over 4,327 hours of therapy. 268 individuals attended educational classes taught by clinical staff for a combined total of 890 staff hours. 58 sessions of support groups ran for 116 hours.

Crisis Nurseries: 24/7 free short-term childcare for families in crisis situations and children at-risk of abuse or neglect. 1,443 children made 9,211 visits to the crisis nursery, including 858 overnight stays, 9,671 meals, and over 51,531 hours of care.

In-Home Parenting Programs: Free in-home parenting support. The Family Mentor Program served 182 individuals in 52 families with in-home support. The Peer Parenting Program served 387 individuals in 102 families with in-home support.

KidStart Daycare: Low-cost, bilingual, curriculum-based daycare services for low-income working families. 69 children were served with 8,960 hours of care.

LifeStart Village: Housing and self-sufficiency program for homeless single parents and their children. 234 individuals were served across all three phases of the program. Over 764 hours of case management and 1,118 hours of counseling were provided.
